

Clinical and Surgical Gastroenterology DEPARTMENT OF GASTROENREROLOGY

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The administrative sector of the Clinical Gastroenterology Service operates on the same floor as the Gastric Surgery Service. The wards of both services also operate on the nineth floor of the Central Institute of the Hospital das Clínicas.

The Clinical Gastroenterology Service has the outpatient clinics related to diseases of the esophagus, stomach, intestines and pancreas operating in the same space in the outpatient building, which is located next to the Central Institute.

Regarding liver diseases, there are specific clinics related to viral hepatitis, non-alcoholic fatty liver disease, liver nodules and hepatocellular carcinoma, metabolic and autoimmune liver diseases and cholestasis. These outpatient clinics operate in the outpatient clinic building. The service also provides care for liver transplantation patients and those on the transplant list. It also has the propaedeutic services of digestive endoscopy, phmetry and esophageal electromanometry and liver imaging (abdominal ultrasound and liver elastography).

There are also didactic activities in meetings with discussion of clinical cases and presentations of updates on important topics in the specialty.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

To discuss the specific gastrointestinal diseases focusing on epidemiology, pathogenesis, diagnosis, treatment (medical and surgical) and outcomes, all based on real cases.

Visitors will live the day-by-day practice at our department.



TEACHING METHODS

Didactic (academic) visits to patients' wards and consultations at the outpatients clinic with a tutor/professor.

Lectures and case discussions.

Participation in daily medical activities at our department.
